Poster & Oral Presenters

- Each student should prepare a 10 minute presentation for oral presentations or a research poster for poster presentations.
- Judging of Presentations will happen June 11,12,13,17,18,19,20 via Zoom
- Each room will have two live judges and a moderator

Poster & Oral Presenters

- It is imperative that students arrive at least 3 minutes prior to their assigned time. You will be placed in the waiting room until your designated timeslot.
- Your timeslot will have 20 minutes of time
- 2-3 minute setup
- 10 minutes presentation
- 5-7 minute Q&A and Debrief

Categories

- The oral & poster sessions are divided into 6 categories:
 - Humanities
 - Life Science
 - Physical Science
 - Social Science
 - Education
 - Health
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- Each category will have a 1st, 2nd, & 3rd place winner.
 - The poster is a separate category and there will also be a 1st, 2nd, & 3rd place winner.

Presentations will be judged on the following:

- Provided background information, a statement of the problem, or posed a research question
- Cited previous research or literature or other information to further clarify and/or describe the problem or research topic
- Described and/or explained research methodology (for example: sample, major variables, design & measure)
- The presentation was thorough and provided findings and results and provided answers and/or solution to the identified problem or embellished the description
- Well organized and well prepared with the flow and structure of the presentation
- **PLEASE NOTE: ALL JUDGING DECISIONS ARE FINAL!**

Presentations will be judged on the following:

- Significance of research in making contributions to the field of study and offered findings and conclusions that added significantly to the field of study
- Maintained appropriate eye contact with the audience, was audible and utilized clear diction
- Made an emotional and/or intellectual impact on the audience
- Revealed and discussed implications for further research
- Demonstrated professional poise in responding to questions

- Must bring poster
- Provided stand, board, and pins for poster
- Student must be at poster during entire time

- Your timeslot will have 20 minutes of time
- 2-3 minute setup
- 10 minutes presentation
- 5-7 minute Q&A and Debrief
- Laptop and Monitor will be provided in the room
- Setup will commence at 8:00 a.m.
